Applicant Information Summary

Aim of the Fund

Thanks to a generous donation of £3,000 from All Aboard Charity Shops, Young Barnet Foundation can continue to offer a Micro Grant for Training & Development in 2024.

Following our recent member renewal process, and noting other wider sector evidence, As the cost-of-living crisis plunges more families into a poverty trap, more children than ever are turning to the youth sector as their only way to experience fun, expand their horizons, boost confidence & develop friendships in an affordable, safe & creative structure. However, the local youth sector is under threat thanks to a perfect storm or increasing pressures, high rates of worker burnout & poor prospects for career development. The Civil Society's recent survey among charity leaders revealed that 66% of respondents cited that their concerns about worker burnout & employee retention had worsened in the last 12 months. Our own interactions, observations & conversations corroborate this view. Without career development pathways & support for staff, many of the organisations & the services they provide to vulnerable young people & their families will cease.

Our Micro Training Fund project addresses these issues in a constructive & proven way. With your engagement, we hope to disperse grants of up to £250 to smaller trusted community organisations, enabling them to undertake vital training & career development for their staff, trustees & volunteers. In turn, this will enhance workers' confidence, skillsets & rates of retention, & improve the scope & quality of services for Barnet's vulnerable young people.

As part of Young Barnet Foundation's core mission to support and build capacity within the Children and Young Peoples Voluntary Sector within the London Borough of Barnet, Space2Grow#32 – Micro Round is aimed at helping those Young Barnet Foundation members who are members as of Monday 13th May 2024 to deliver Training & Development to their staff and / or

Geographical Area of Benefit	This fund is open to VCSE members who deliver activities and services for children and young people living or at school/college in the London Borough of Barnet. Applicants must have been a member of Young Barnet Foundation as of Monday 13 th May 2024 to be eligible to apply for this funding and have a turnover of £250,000 or less in the most recent financial year.

	Applications for Training & Development which help support staff with employee resilience and mental health will be welcomed.

However, we do assess and score projects in terms of the 'leverage' that our grant may bring about in terms of cash match funding and in-kind contributions. We aim to give advice to applicants and signpost them to other funders.

Delivery, Partnerships & Networks:


- We want to encourage projects that develop or strengthen delivery of services to children and young

Geographic Location:

• The fund is open to CYP projects within the London Borough of Barnet.

Project Start:

Applicants are asked to apply only if their project can complete within six months of award of grant.



Minimum eligibility criteria:

- Applicants must be a member of the Young Barnet Foundation as of 13th May 2024 (complying with the YBF membership criteria) – membership is free.
- Applicants must have a turnover of £250,000 or less in the most recent financial year.
- Applicants must be a voluntary and community sector organisation as for example defined by the National Council for Voluntary Organisations:

- Applicants must not be one of the excluded types of organisations as outlined below
- The purpose of the grant must be to pay towards the delivery of Training or Development opportunities via an appropriate provider of such training. The proposed training should contribute to the organisations core Charitable objectives, and demonstrate the ability to either support existing provision or build the capacity of the organisation. This can include Continuing Professional Development to enable staff to maintain existing accreditations or qualifications.
- The project/activity/programme for which funding is being sought does not have to be new but should be based on a need or an identified gap/need in service.
- Applicants must have a bank account in the name of the organisation or group, which requires at least two joint signatories, who are not related, for all transactions.
- Have the necessary systems, policies and procedures that fulfil legal requirements e.g. accounts, health and safety, equal opportunities, insurance, safeguarding etc (these requirements will be checked as part of the application process).
- All staff working to deliver the project must be DBS checked and organisations must follow strong safeguarding procedures as detailed in their safeguarding policy.
- Funds awarded through this round of funding must be spent within six months of award and the Monitoring & Evaluation for your project provided within one month of completion of the Training and Development having been undertaken.
- The Space2Grow fund is not able to fund continuing projects which take place over a number of years
- We encourage all members to undertake the self-assessed Charity Excellence Framework quality mark
 or the more advanced London Youth Quality Mark' scheme. This is not a condition merely an
 encouragement to ensure that organisations are aware and supported to adopt procedures that help
 them develop and offer required safeguards to their organisation and the young people they support.

Grant Monitoring Process:

All grant recipients will be required to monitor their projects against pre-determined criteria provided and submit monitoring reports. Reports will be required at the end of the project, as agreed with the Grants Committee. This monitoring will not be onerous, but will include:

- How the Charity's grant was used including relevant documentation, receipts etc.
- Numbers of staff and / or trustees who undertook the training and development.
- Evidence of any qualifications and / or accreditations gained or maintained
- A quote from your organisation regarding the impact the grant has made

Please note: reporting is not designed to be onerous, however, we need to evidence the impact of funding so that we can grow local funding to support the sector further along with accounting for Public Money.

Application process:

Applications must be submitted online using the form available on the Young Barnet Foundation website, [

Decision Making Process:

Assessment: Grants will be reviewed to ensure eligibility by Young Barnet Foundation Grants Administration staff. Eligible applications will be forwarded to Senior Young Barnet Foundation Staff and Trustees for review and decision.

The review and decision process will be undertaken each 2-3 weeks that the fund is open, until all funds are allocated. The funding panel's decision is final. There is no appeal process in place. Due to the expected volume of applicants, it will not be possible to give feedback at this time.

Panel Outcome: Applicants will be notified of the outcome of their application within 28 days of submission, where possible. The outcome of the application may be:

- Full Grant
- Partial Grant
- Decline / Not Eligible
- Where we have declined an application, we will try to signpost your application to other funders, partners or members who may be able to assist.

Exclusions: Young Barnet Foundation's mission is to support the local CYP VCS; therefore, the Grants Panel cannot consider applications for/from the following: -

Sole benefit of individuals.	Bursaries for higher education (including postgraduate)	
National organisations with no track record of delivery in the Charity's beneficial area	Programmes that fall under PHSE or Citizenship.	
Other grant-giving organisations	Conservation and environmental projects where the project is primarily conservation focused and not children and young people.	
Housing Associations	Core costs for umbrella bodies or second tier organisations	
Hospitals, Hospices or Clinical Commissioning Groups	Political or religious activities (although secular projects by faith groups are welcomed where there is a wider community benefit).	
Statutory bodies to fund their normal services or activities (including Schools etc). Please see 'Minimum eligibility criteria' above.	Retrospective funding.	
For statutory obligations	Overnight school journeys or trips abroad	
General charitable appeals	Events/activity whose principle aim is to raise funds for other organisations.

This is not an exhaustive list and applicants should contact us if they are unsure whether they qualify to apply.

Informing us of significant events.

It is necessary for you to keep Young Barnet Foundation informed of any significant events that will have an impact on the work that we are funding, or on your organisation. Please do not wait until the end of your grant to advise us of these changes.

You should inform Young Barnet Foundation immediately if any of the following changes occur:

- A major organisational change or new policy direction
- A change to your organisation's name or constitution
- Significant and unexpected changes to your Trustee board
- A severe funding crisis or other threat to the viability of the organisation including insolvency.
- A potential merger
- Winding up of the organisation
- Any other significant change to your organisation or project.

Terms and definition

Voluntary and community sector

The Voluntary & Community Sector (VCS, sometimes referred to as the Third Sector), is the term used to describe the range of organisations which are neither state nor the private sector. It includes organisations such as associations, self-help and community groups, voluntary organisations, social enterprises, housing associations, mutuals and co-operatives. Such organisations are sometimes, but not always, charitable (as defined in law) but may be registered charities. VCS Organisations are independent of government; 'value-driven' – that is, they pursue social, environmental, or cultural objectives rather than primarily aiming to make

profit; they reinvest any surpluses, or in the case of Social Enterprises all surpluses, in the pursuit of their objectives.

A **constituted group** is a **group** of people who come together to further any objective; in this case, to support children and young people. The **group** is run on a voluntary basis and is set up as a small organisation in its own right, with a management committee, constitution, and its own bank account.
